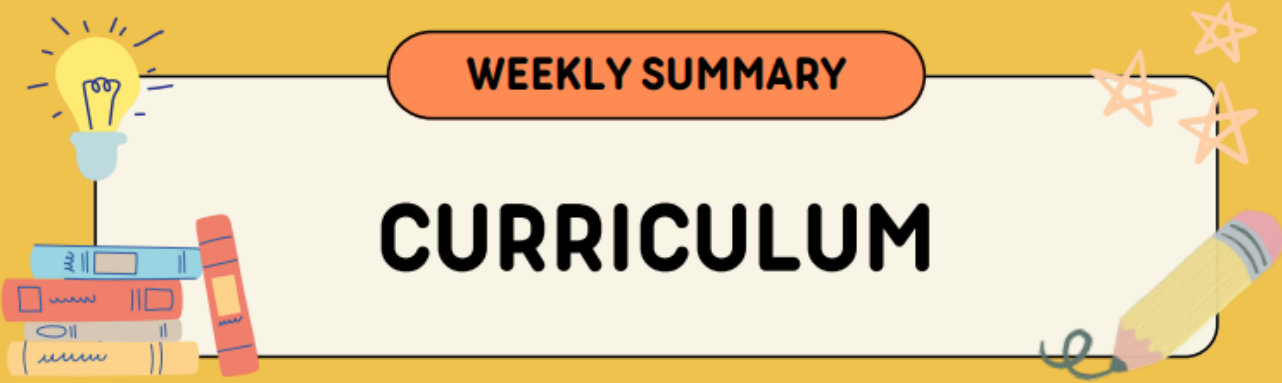

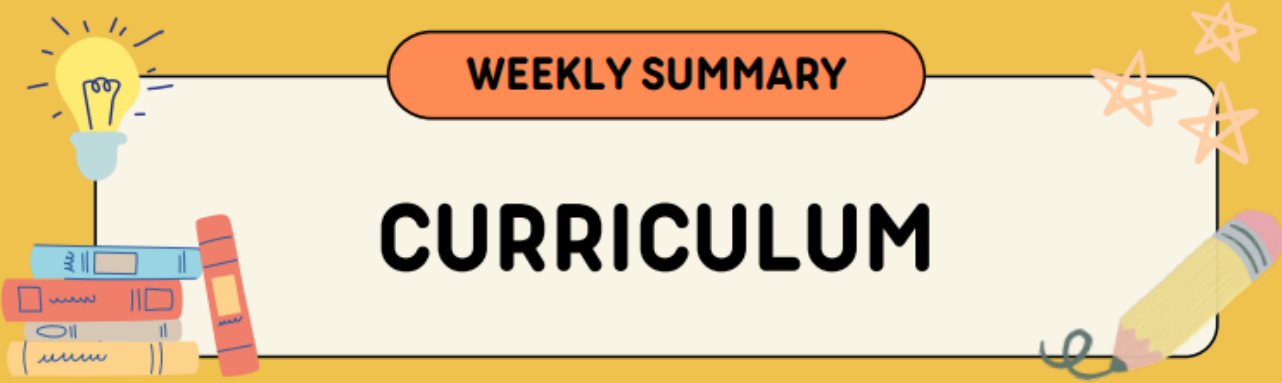
WEEKLY SUMMARY

CURRICULUM

Each week we will be letting you know in this newsletter, a snapshot of what the children have been learning in class. For an overview of the term's work, please go to the [class pages](#) on our website where you will find more information.

Reception	This week Reception have really enjoyed Healthy Schools Week which has been full of lots of exciting activities including skipping, fencing, yoga, street dance, scooting and making healthy fruit kebabs. We also recapped how to cross the road safely and how to clean our hands properly to stay healthy. In Maths we have started our next module 'Visualise, Build and Map' where the children have revisited repeated patterns and created their own repeated patterns. This has included patterns of colour, patterns of shape, sound patterns and action patterns. The children also looked at spatial reasoning and position by recreating scenes from a maths story. In Literacy the children continued working on the text 'Peepo!' by Janet Allan Ahlberg where they described old toys using adjectives and wrote predictions about what they thought the book would be about based on the front cover. They also wrote a big list of toys they could see in the story. In Phonics, the children have been working hard to increase their blending fluency and read and write their tricky words. Several of the Reception children even made their own tricky word board games in busy learning time too. Finally, to top it all off the children also took part in a Drama Workshop where they got to go on an adventure with Peter Pan.
Year 1	This week in English, Year 1 have been enjoying the story <i>Alan's Big, Scary Teeth</i>, using clues from the text and illustrations to make predictions about what might happen next. In Maths, we have been exploring tens and ones, partitioning numbers up to 100 to deepen our understanding of place value. We loved our Science lesson, where we planted sunflower seeds and discussed each step needed to help them grow successfully. We have also thoroughly enjoyed taking part in the many sporting activities this week, demonstrating excellent teamwork and determination.
Year 2	It has been such a fun and engaging week at school as we have taken part in a variety of workshops linked to Healthy Schools Week. In Maths, we have continued our learning about time, focusing on telling the time past and to the hour. Next week, we will begin learning about tally charts, block diagrams and pictograms, developing our skills in collecting and presenting data. In Science, we carried out a minibeast hunt and explored the forest area where we will be building our bug hotels. Enthusiastically, the children planned their designs and discussed the materials they would need. They will be bringing these in on Monday to begin constructing their bug hotels. We were delighted to see, during our follow-up visit to the growing garden, that our spinach seedlings have started to appear! The recent warm weather along with rain has helped and we look forward to observing and recording their progress over the coming weeks.





WEEKLY SUMMARY

CURRICULUM

Year 3	Year 3 have really enjoyed Healthy Schools Week and have been skipping, skateboarding and learning to throw frisbees. In Science we have learnt about different food groups and which ones are healthy for a balanced diet, while in Maths we have been practising telling the time. We started a new book this week called 'The Boy Who Grew Dragons' and in History we were learning about the Romans invasion of Great Britain.
Year 4	What a fantastic week we've had. We have designed clothes for Queen Victoria, designed a bathing machine for her to be able to swim in the sea, writing explanation sentences using conjunctions as to how it works and started reading our new book, Queen Victoria's Bathing Machine. In history, we have placed key periods of time in British history, and have thought about what we know about the Victorians. We have all undertaken the times tables check and we were fantastic! In the afternoons, we have had lots of sporting activities. We started off with yoga, which was a great start to the week. We have also learnt to do tricks with skipping ropes, sped along on skateboards, learnt about keeping safe near water and how to eat healthily. We are looking forward to our sports day on Monday.
Year 5	It has been a busy week in Year 5. The children have worked hard to complete their end of year assessments in spelling, reading, grammar, and maths. On top of this, we have enjoyed an action-packed Healthy Schools Week. The children have tried skipping, yoga, skateboarding, a football tournament, skincare, and ultimate frisbee. They have also learnt about water safety and healthy eating. We are all looking forward to sports day next week!
Year 6	This week, Year 6 enthusiastically took part in our Healthy Schools Week, enjoying a range of exciting activities designed to promote healthy lifestyles, physical activity, and personal safety. One of the highlights of the week was Bikeability, where pupils developed their cycling skills and learned how to ride safely and confidently on the road. The children demonstrated excellent focus and responsibility throughout the training sessions. Year 6 also represented the school brilliantly in a football tournament. The children showed fantastic teamwork, determination, and sportsmanship, making us all proud both on and off the pitch. During a fun and energetic skipping workshop, pupils learned new skipping techniques and challenged themselves to improve their coordination, fitness, and perseverance. As part of our focus on healthy lifestyles, the children participated in a healthy eating workshop. They explored the importance of making nutritious food choices and then put their learning into practice by designing and baking their own delicious sugar-free muffins. The results were impressive, and the muffins were enjoyed by all! To complete the week, pupils took part in a water safety session led by the RNLI. They learned valuable lifesaving knowledge about staying safe in and around water and were delighted to earn their Water Safety Passport. Healthy Schools Week has been a fantastic opportunity for Year 6 to develop important life skills, stay active, and learn how to make healthy and safe choices. We are incredibly proud of their enthusiasm, participation, and positive attitudes throughout the week.

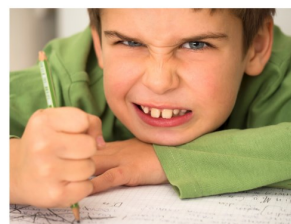
